WELCOME TO THE WEEKLY WONDER

A bigger creative challenge for curious kids

Weekly Wonders are open-ended drawing challenges designed to help children imagine, invent and create in their own way.

Your child can use the guide in the app, draw on this printed sheet, or start completely from scratch. There is no correct answer and no perfect version to copy. The goal is simply to help them begin, explore an idea, and feel proud of what they make.

How your child can use this activity

They can:

- follow the starter idea in the app
- use the printed sheet as a drawing activity
- draw their own version on plain paper
- add words, labels, characters or stories
- talk through their idea with you
- present their finished creation like a mini project

A simple way to guide them

Try asking:

- What is it called?
- Who uses it?
- What is the funniest part?
- What would happen next?

You do not need to correct the drawing or help them make it realistic. Encouragement is the important bit.

When they are finished

Invite your child to show you what they made. They might want to:

- give it a title
- explain the idea
- describe their favourite part
- act out a story about it
- display it on the fridge, wall or create a gallery at home.
- keep it in a folder as part of their Wonderkid collection

Weekly Wonders are about creative confidence, not perfect drawings.

If they can say “I made that”, it worked.

This Week's Wonder:

Invent a Playground for Monsters

This week, your child is designing a playground for friendly monsters.

They might draw a slime slide, a cloud swing, a bouncy mountain, a tunnel for tiny monsters, or something completely different. They can use the guide in the app, draw on the printed sheet, or start again on plain paper.

The best ideas are often the silliest ones.

Help them present it:

When they have finished, ask them to give you a tour of the playground.

You could ask:

What is your playground called?

Which monster plays here?

What is the most exciting thing to do?

Is anything dangerous, funny or surprising?

What rule would monsters have to follow?

They could present it like a designer, tour guide, inventor or playground manager.
