

Creative Cup Challenge

Design a Team Badge

This Creative Cup challenge invites your child to design a badge for an imaginary team.

They might add colours, shapes, stripes, stars, symbols, patterns, a mascot, a team name, or something nobody has ever seen before. They can use the guide in the app, draw on the printed sheet, or start again on plain paper.

The best team badges are full of personality, surprise and imagination.

Help them present it:

When they have finished, ask them to show you their team badge.

You could ask:

What is the team called?

What do the colours mean?

What symbols did you choose?

What makes this team special?

Is the team brave, silly, magical, speedy or something else?

They could present it like a team designer, coach, mascot maker or proud supporter.

Creative Cup Make & Create

Make a Team Badge

This Creative Cup activity invites your child to turn their team idea into a badge they can decorate, cut out and display.

They can use this sheet to make a badge for an imaginary team. It could be brave, funny, magical, sporty, tiny, loud, colourful or completely unexpected.

There is no correct way to make it. The goal is simply to help them create something they feel proud of.

You will need:

- this activity sheet
- pencils, pens or crayons
- scissors
- glue or tape
- card or thicker paper if you want it to be sturdier
- string, a safety pin, or a lolly stick if you want to display it

A grown-up may need to help with cutting, sticking or attaching the badge.

Help them present it:

When they have finished, ask them to introduce their team badge.

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How to make it:

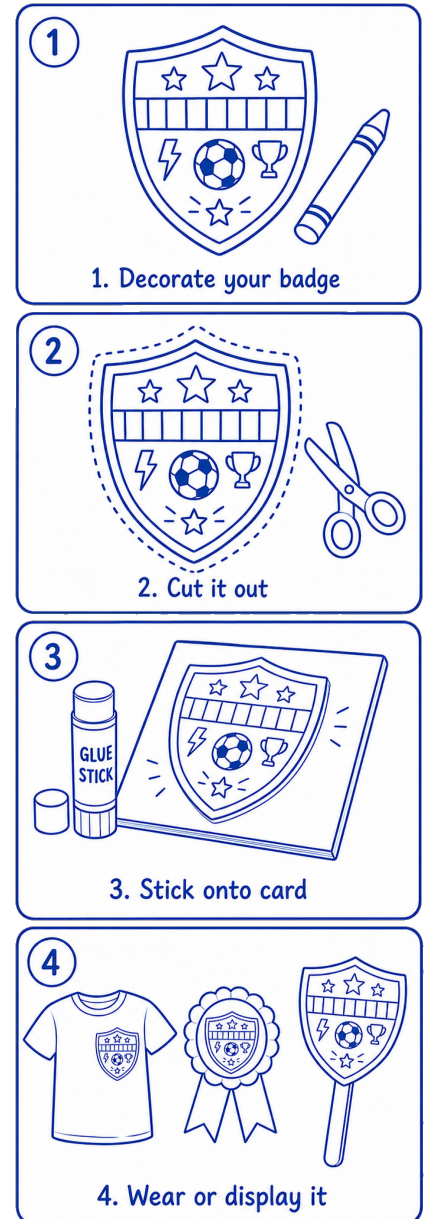
1. Decorate the team badge with colours, symbols, patterns and pictures.
2. Add a team name if you want to.
3. Carefully cut the badge out.
4. Stick it onto card if you want to make it stronger.
5. Turn it into something you can wear, hold or display.

You could:

- wear it like a badge
- tape it to a wall or bedroom door
- turn it into a flag
- attach it to a stick
- add ribbons to make it look like an award rosette

You could ask:

What is your team called?
Who would wear this badge?
What does the badge tell us about the team?
What is your favourite part?
If the team had a chant, what would it sound like?
